

HIPPY Success Story from Elmore County

Our success is made most evident by the growth and expansion we have experienced as a program at large. The positive impact of the program motivated the Elmore County Board of Education to expand the program to include the Eclectic, Holtville and Millbrook school

communities, in addition to Wetumpka, which was the only area served in 2008/2009. The roster of families who will benefit from HIPPY in Elmore County has grown from 20 in 2008/2009 to 40 in 2011/2012. In addition to helping educate our families, we have provided valuable services to them, such as offering free vision/hearing screenings and free oral hygiene kits with information on how to best care for a preschooler's teeth. We have also teamed up with our Board of Education Special Education Department to identify students who are eligible to receive special services

now, thereby helping them benefit from early intervention. Other evidence that we are helping not only children, but adults as well, lies in the fact that two of our Parent Educators have committed to returning to school themselves to get degrees that will allow them to seek full time employment in our school system. Overall, what we have been able to achieve in Elmore County with our local HIPPY program has been remarkable, and we confidently anticipate continued growth and success.
